









Fisheries Disasters - Status as of 08/30/2024

Planned for FY24 obligation:

- 93 NY Scallop (\$750K)
- 104 / 105 WA state salmon (\$7.2M)
- 106 / 107 Upper Cook Inlet; Copper River; Prince William Sound salmon (\$43.7M)
- 109 Pacific cod, Gulf of Alaska (\$17.7M)
- 115 Chignik salmon (\$4.9M)
- 116 / 119 / 126 King crab and snow crab (\$193M)
- 118 / 121 / 123 Copper River, Kuskokwim River, and Norton Sound salmon (\$16.9M)



Fisheries Disasters - Status as of 08/30/2024

Most of the following have cleared OMB; due to timing in the current FY, will process in FY25:

- 129 / 134 2021/22 Yurok Tribe Fall Chinook Salmon Fishery (\$8.1M)
- 130 2023 CA Sacramento River Fall Chinook, Klamath River Fall Chinook, Ocean & Inland Salmon Fisheries (\$20M)
- 98 / 114 / 120 / 122 / 127 West Coast Tribal, OR, & AK Salmon and CA Sea Urchin (\$11.9M)
- 117 2020 MS Oyster and Shrimp Fisheries (Hurricane Ida) (\$2.9M)
- 101 / 113 2020 & 2021/22 LA Hurricane Ida & Laura (\$27M)


Also likely obligate in FY25; waiting on various clearances in disaster process:


- 140 2023/24 Bering Sea Snow Crab Fishery
 - Partially funded, \$39.5M available; determination of impact is \$205.9M Waiting Senate approval
- 138 / 136 / 132 Alaska/Upper Cook Inlet Setnet Fishery, Nelson Lagoon Salmon, Kuskokwim River Chinook, Coho, Chum Salmon
 - \$12.2M Application pending from PSMFC
- 111 2020 Washington Fraser River Sockeye & Puget Sound Fall Chum Salmon Fisheries (Port Gamble S'Klallam Tribe)
 - Pending inflation discussions with OMB, ~\$343K


